The Education Ministry Department

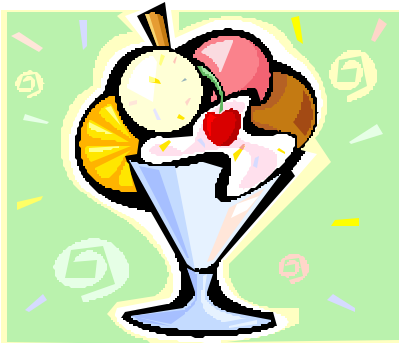

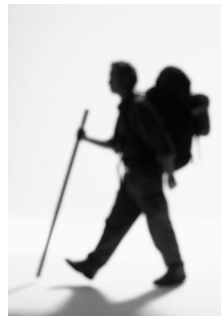

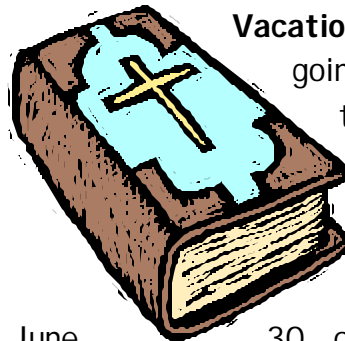


Colorado Backpacking Trip

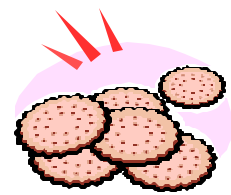

Cookies for Chi Rhos!

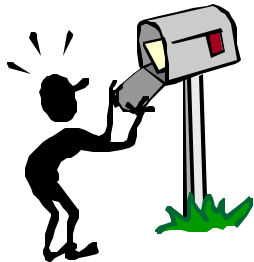
Looking for something that you can contribute to the Chi Rhos Mission trip? How about cookies!! We

VBS MISSION PROJECT INFORMATION FROM CONNIE BURKE

This year at VBS we will be participating in several mission projects. Each night the kids and adults will receive information about some needs both in our community and the world which we can help meet. To give you some advance warning of what we will be doing, I have put this list of projects into this newsletter so that when we call for them at VBS each night, you will be prepared. This list will also be available when you register for VBS.

PROJECT #1 - SAN MARCOS FOOD BANK

Canned food and non perishable foods such as beans, rice, etc. will be collected for the San Marcos Area Food Bank.

PROJECT #2 - CHURCH WORLD SERVICE KIDS KITS - for victims of Tsunami or other victims of disasters and violence around the world

Kids Kits contents are listed below. Bring any of these items to make up Kids Kits or make up a complete Kids Kit, or donate money to purchase needed items and pay for postage to send the kits to Church World Service.

KIDS KIT

Our brand new Heart-to-Heart Kids Kit recognizes that even as faces must be washed and bellies must be fed, laughter must be heard as well. To assemble a Kids Kit you will need:

- One Rubbermaid® Clear Impressions shoebox with lid, 6.5 qt., or other flexible clear plastic 6.5 qt. shoebox with lid
- One small stuffed bear
- One soft small ball
- One harmonica, or other small musical instrument
- One 6" x 9" non-spiral bound pad of regular or construction paper (60-100 sheets)
- One slinky
- One yo-yo
- One 7-foot child's jump rope
- One comb
- One toothbrush
- One tube of toothpaste (4-7 ounces)
- One box of 24 crayons
- One large eraser
- Six new pencils with erasers
- One pencil sharpener
- One 30-centimeter ruler (12")
- One pair blunt child's scissors

Remove excess packaging so that items fit snugly in box. Place all items inside the shoebox, close lid, and tie securely with ribbon. No time to make a kit? Donate \$24.00 to Church World Service for the price of a Heart-to-Heart Kids Kit.

*Processing/shipping: \$ 3.00 per Kit.

PROJECT #3 - CHURCH WORLD SERVICE KIDS KITS - for Southwest Good Samaritan Ministries both for children of refugees and the orphanage in Matamoros

The same list of items listed above for Church World Service will also be collected for the Southwest Good Samaritan Ministries in the valley. This is the same place our Chi Rho youth visit each year on their mission trip.

PROJECT #4 - FOOD FOR THE ANIMAL SHELTER

We will collect dry food and canned food for the Animal Shelter in San Marcos

These projects will be continued through June and early July. If you are unable to attend VBS this year, please help us with these wonderful mission projects to help meet the needs of others and to promote an awareness of our need to be servants like our Savior, Jesus the Christ. Do you know who wrote over 1,000 songs? Why, Solomon, of course. (1 Kings 4:32) One of my favorite sets of books in our library has 27 pages devoted to Solomon, including 4 pages of beautiful color illustrations by Maurice Bower.

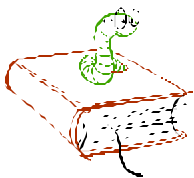
From Aaron to Zuzim, this small set of 16 volumes of The Living Bible Encyclopedia in Story and Pictures is the best set of Biblical reference books I have ever seen.

Copyrighted in 1968 by H. S. Stuttman Co., Inc., this series serves both adult and younger readers. It combines the Zondervan Pictorial Bible Dictionary, stories and narratives from the Know Your Bible Program, a gallery of 480 paintings based on Bible themes and the most fascinating photographs of contemporary scenes and archaeological finds in the Holy Land.

In all, there are 2,132 pages full of information and explanations that will enlighten the reader about anything and everything in the Bible. I highly recommend this set of books to you for study and enrichment.

Next month, James will contribute to this column and Joann Schlotter has volunteered for the next one after that. There are several hundred good books in our library just waiting for you to check them out and enjoy their contents. Don't forget to bring them back so others can also enjoy them.
